Berthoud is open for business. The town trustees and staff understand how important the business community is to the financial well being of the town. We are working diligently through the Berthoud Economic Resource Team (BERT) to improve the way the town works with businesses. We have a business consultant who will be available to help businesses with whatever their needs might be. The "Business Retention Team" will be meeting with existing business owners and asking survey questions and getting feedback on how the town can serve them more effectively.

We are also working on bringing new primary employers to Berthoud who will increase the tax base and hire employees who will shop at Berthoud businesses and buy Berthoud homes.

During the last year we have seen three new businesses make a significant investment in the economy of Berthoud: Lehman Communications, Brookside Gardens and Brothers Door Supply.

The Mountain Avenue Project resulted in new infrastructure under Mountain Avenue, and the adjacent property owners received new sidewalks.

The Main Street Program, through a grant, was able to fund the new lamp posts and the medallions in the bulb-outs. Still to come will be benches, bicycle racks, street level planters and hanging planters.

The Chamber of Commerce has played a significant role in creating a healthy business environment by hosting monthly luncheons that feature informative and instructive guest speakers and monthly after-hours provide an opportunity for business owners to network. Two annual community-wide events, Berthoud Day and Oktoberfest are hosted by the Chamber. Don Dana, executive director, also played a key role, along with the committee, on a very successful "Christmas in Berthoud 2008" last December.

Lines of communication have been opened and we invite and welcome input from our business community. We appreciate the business you do, and we appreciate your participation in the many activities required to cultivate a town where good things grow.
