Berthoud's Main Street Program

The goal of the Berthoud Main Street Program is to provide economic development opportunities within the context of historic preservation. The Berthoud Main Street Program uses a four point approach based upon the National Trust for Historic Preservation formula for success. The four points include downtown design, downtown promotions, economic development and organization, which encompasses fundraising and communication. The Berthoud Main Street Program is volunteer-based. This group of volunteers has worked to utilize the four point approach while tailoring it to meet our community's strategy for strengthening and redeveloping our historic downtown.

Berthoud Area Transportation Service (BATS)

Berthoud Area Transportation Service (BATS) is a demand-response transportation service operated by the town of Berthoud. If you call 532-3049 with at least 24 hours notice, you can schedule a trip for the next day. They will arrange to pick you up at a designated time and drop you off at the address you request. Once you are finished with your appointment, they will pick you up and return you to your home. They work to coordinate trips for people who are going in the same general direction. This is not a taxi service, but it is a personable and reliable service.

Providing service to residents who live in Berthoud or within the Berthoud Fire Protection District, they will transport people within the town of Berthoud, to Loveland or Longmont. They do not have a fixed route system, but work to accommodate the needs of our passengers.
